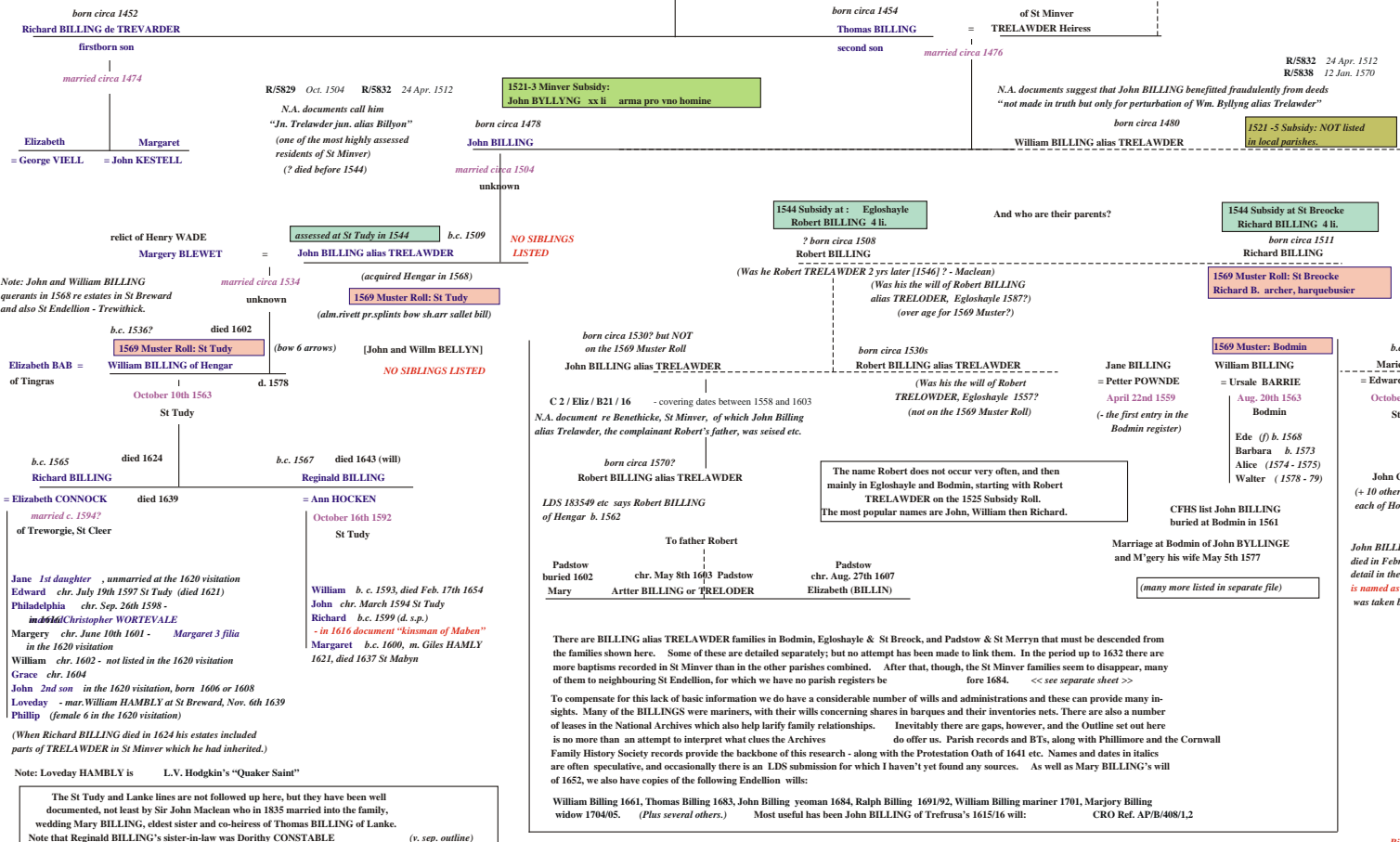


**BILLING OUTLINE**

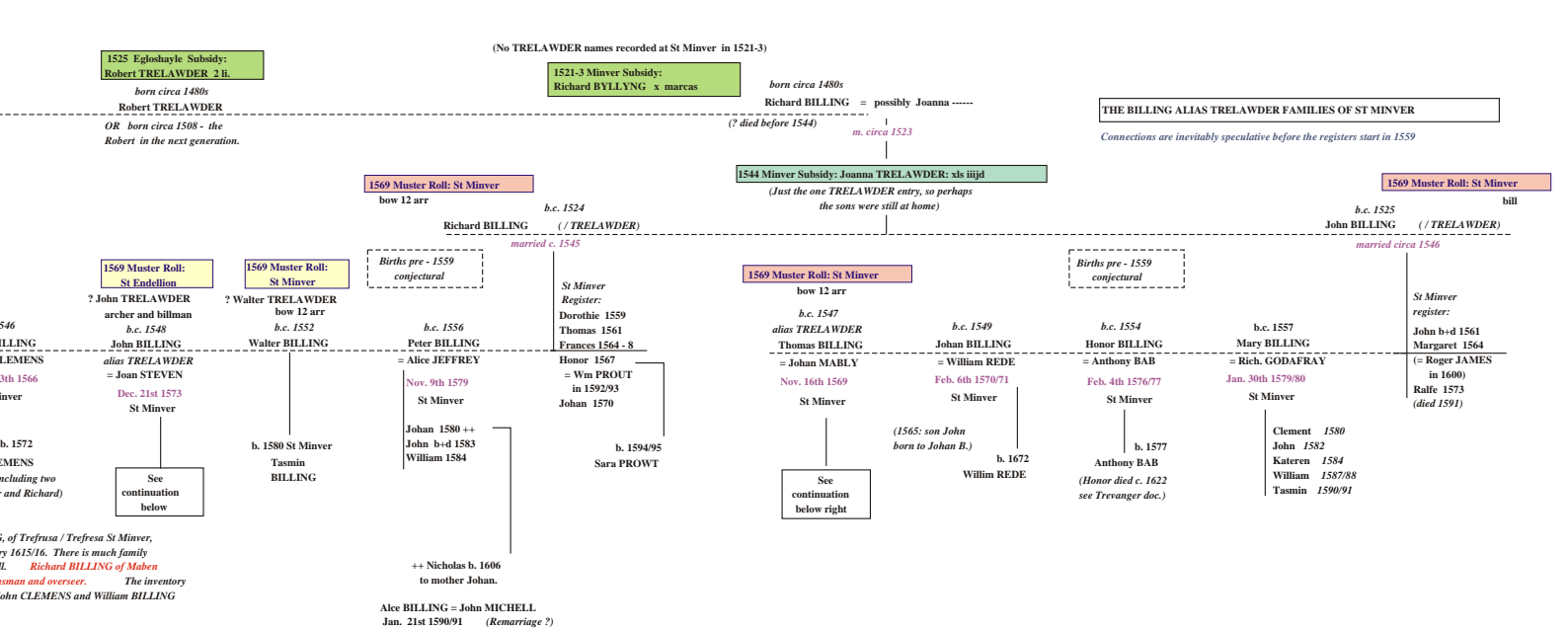
This outline sets out the BILLING alias TRELAWDER family connections in Cornwall over two hundred years. It is unusual to see an alias - our modern equivalent being the hyphenated name - being sustained over so long a time. In many cases, no connections are attempted. At other times links have been suggested. The spelling of TRELAWDER does vary, sometimes TRELADER or TRELOTHER etc. Where transcripts have shown TRELANDER these have been changed to TRELAWDER after expert examination of the original documents. Sir John Maclean explains the background to the use of the alias in his work "The Parochial and Family History of the Deanery of Trigg Minor, Cornwall", first published in 1874. Comments, corrections, etc would be welcome. Note that John BILLING of Trefusa, St Minver, specifically refers in his will of 1616 to Richard BILLING of Mahen (St Mahyn) as a kinsman. THE HERALD'S VISITATION OF 1620 FOCUSED SOLELY ON THE LINE OF JOHN BILLING / TRELAWDER'S FIRST SON JOHN WHO MARRIED MARGERY BLEWET AND SETTLED AT ST TUDY IN THE 1540S. THIS LINE IS SHOWN HERE IN PURPLE ON THE LEFT HAND SIDE AS SET OUT IN 1874 BY THE HARLEIAN SOCIETY AND USED BY SIR JOHN MACLEAN IN HIS RESEARCH. OTHER BRANCHES OF THE FAMILY STAYED IN ST MINVER AND IN THE ST BROECK / EGLOSHAYLE AREA. THESE WERE NOT CHRONICLED, BUT WE MAY ASSUME THAT RICHARD, AT ST MINVER IN 1523, AND WILLIAM BILLING ALIAS TRELAWDER, THE CASUALTY OF THE 1512 FRAUD, WERE THEIR DIRECT LINE. I AM ASSUMING HERE THAT THE ST MINVER FAMILIES ARE DESCENDED FROM RICHARD AND THE RIGHT HAND SIDE OF THE PAGE SHOWS HOW THIS MIGHT HAVE COME ABOUT. THE EGLOSHAYLE AND BODMIN FAMILIES ARE ONLY TOUCHED ON HERE.

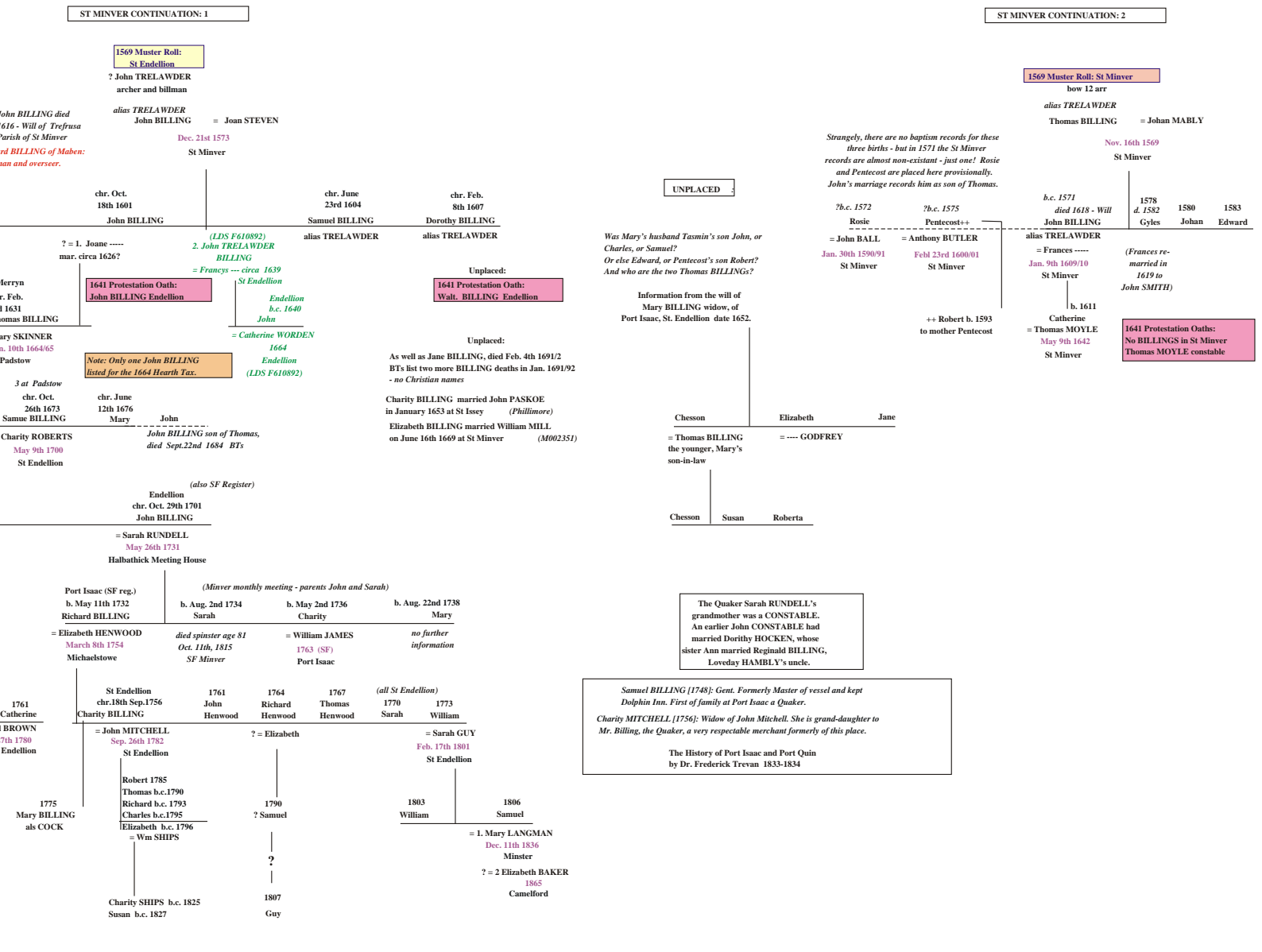
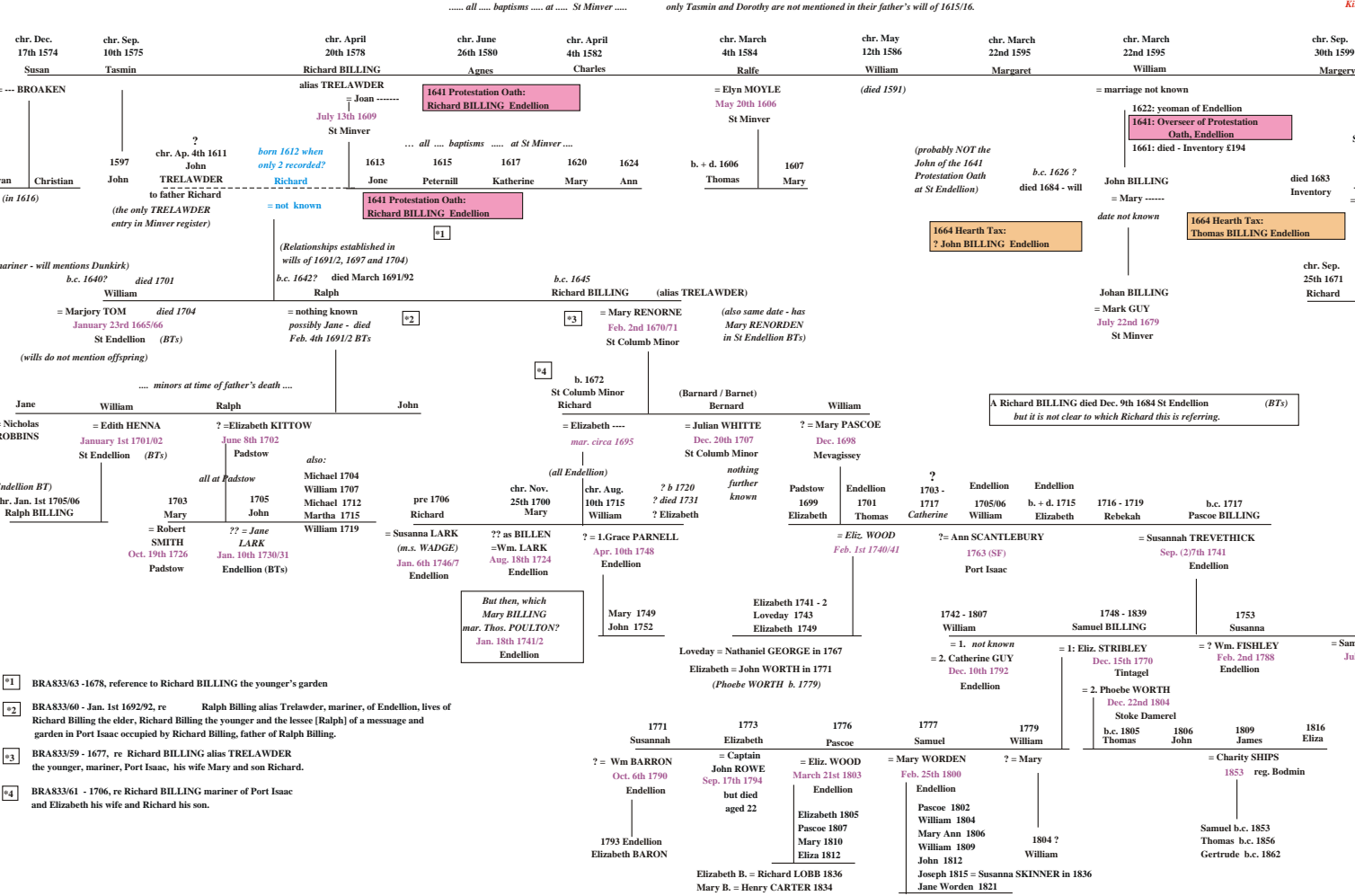


**Summary of what is a rather large chart:**

1 BRAR3363 -1678, reference to Richard BILLING the younger's garden  
2 BRAR3360 - Jan. 1st 1692/9e, re Ralph Billing alias Trelawder, mariner, of Endellion, lives of Richard Billing the elder, Richard Billing the younger and the lessee (Ralph) of a message and garden in Port Isaac occupied by Richard Billing, father of Ralph Billing.  
3 BRAR3359 - 1677, re Richard BILLING alias TRELAWDER the younger, mariner, Port Isaac, his wife Mary and son Richard.  
4 BRAR3361 - 1706, re Richard BILLING mariner of Port Isaac and Elizabeth his wife and Richard his son.
